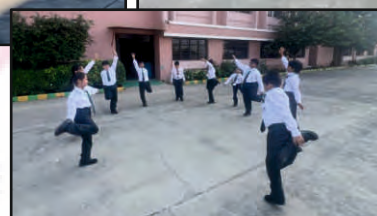

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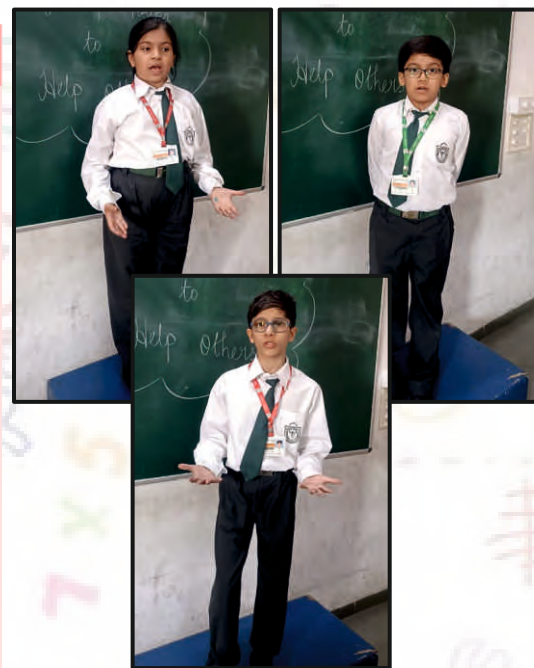
## CBSE Painting Contest: Class-V

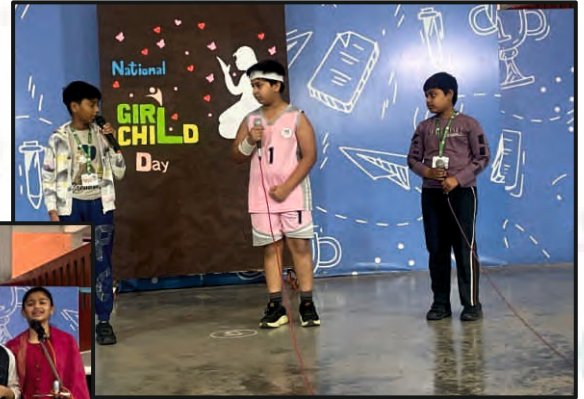




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## National Girl Child Day Assembly

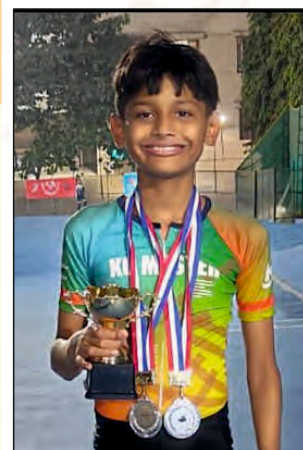


## Fountainhead Inter School Badminton Competition
