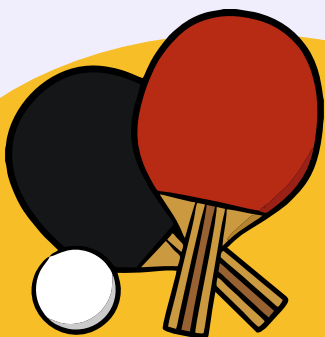


Life Skills Session: I-V

The school counsellor Ms. Prija Sarkar conducted a session for Class I to V on responsible behaviour and road safety. Students were reminded about school do's and don'ts and the importance of following rules everywhere including school and outside school.

During the discussion, two students mentioned that they ride a two-wheeler at high speed, and another student shared that they are learning to drive a car. The counsellor clearly explained that anyone below 18 years is not legally allowed to ride a bike, scooter, or drive a car, and such actions are unsafe and against Indian traffic laws.

The counsellor also informed them that such cases can be handled under the Juvenile Justice Board, highlighting the seriousness of the issue. The session helped students understand safety, legality and responsible behaviour.



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Republic Day Activities

(Classes Nursery to II)

Republic Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm by students of classes Nursery to II in our school. To mark this patriotic occasion, different classes took part in various activities. 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Maths Mela: Class II

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Math Mela: Nursery and Prep

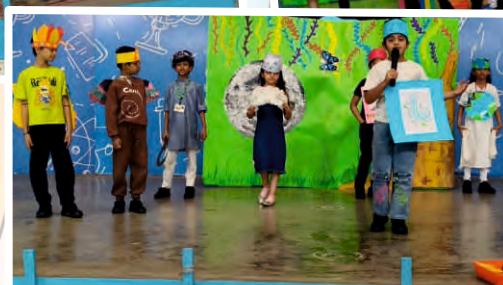
Overall, the Maths Mela was a joyful and enriching experience that reinforced mathematical concepts through play-way methods and fostered a positive attitude towards Mathematics.

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Learning in Action: Nursery & Prep Showcase

The Knowledge and Skills Exhibition for Nursery and Prep students, held on 6 March 2026, was a vibrant celebration of joyful learning where young learners confidently showcased their developing language, numeracy, creativity and communication skills through engaging activities.

The Nursery section, based on the exciting theme “Jungle,” created a lively environment where children explored learning through animals and nature. The students enthusiastically demonstrated their early literacy by reading CVC words, identifying rhyming words and recognizing same ending sounds, strengthening their phonetic awareness. They also read simple sentences and illustrated related pictures, reflecting their comprehension and creativity. To build confidence in speaking, students shared a few lines about different animals. Integrating art with mathematics, they created animals using various shapes, counted and named them and also identified water animals. Their numeracy skills were further highlighted as they recognized numbers, wrote them in the HTO (Hundreds–Tens–Ones) pattern and enjoyed a lively roll-the-dice activity where they named animals and solved simple addition and subtraction sums, making learning both interactive and fun.

The Prep section beautifully presented the theme “Garden,” where students strengthened their language skills through Hindi rhyme recitation about gardens and passage reading on trees. Mathematical understanding was creatively displayed through activities such as skip counting (2, 3, 5, and 10) with butterflies flying over a bridge, and exploring before, after and between numbers along with number names using colourful flower pots. Students also enhanced their observation, creativity and speaking skills by describing and drawing a garden picture and bringing stories to life through role play and storytelling as garden insects.

Parents visited the exhibition and appreciated the students' enthusiasm, confidence and creativity. To celebrate their participation and efforts, students were awarded multiple stickers, making the exhibition a joyful and memorable learning experience for everyone.
